With a scenic mountain flight from Kathmandu to Thimpu, admiring the beautiful arts, the architecture of Thimpu and Paro along with other main attraction of the country. The official trek to the Laya Gasa begins from Paro Valley. On the trail, you will get to see the magnificent mountains of Bhutan. As the trail passes through charming villages located at the high altitude gives you perfect opportunity to experience the Layaps culture, tradition and lifestyle. The hot springs of Gasa are an absolute delight after the hard trekking. Laya Gasa Trek is a perfect gateway for an amazing trip to Bhutan and to the Highland of Bhutan.
