

Bird Watching in Nepal

Phulchoki Hill for Bird Watching Tour

The hill is within the Kathmandu Valley. At an altitude of 2756 m above sea level, the hill provides a rainbow of birdlife. Nearby Kathmandu City Centre, bird enthusiasts can do a day hike to explore the hill and experience the different species of birds in the area. The hill has lush woods and a broad range of habitats. Therefore, you can find different species of birds.

Here is a list of the types of birds found in Phulchoki Hill

Rufous-chinned Laughingthrush, Spotted Dove, Black Drongo, Wedge-tailed Green Pigeon, Rufous-winged Fulvetta, Speckled Wood-Pigeon, Ashy-Wood-Pigeon, Blue-throated Barbet, Golden-throated Barbet, Red-tailed Minla, Hoary-throated Barwing, Himalayan Cutia, Rufous-vented Yuhina, Whistler's Warbler, Rufous-bellied Woodpecker, Crested Goshawk, Crested Serpent-Eagle, Speckled Piculet, Fire-breasted Flower Picker, Striated Bulbul, Hill Partridge, Steppe Eagle, Slaty-headed Parakeet, Lesser Yellownape, Spotted Laughingthrush, Pink-rumped Rosefinch, Brown-fronted Woodpecker.

The rare species of Himalayan Cutia photography tour on Phulchowki Hill is a lovely place for birders. Visitors can expect to see. Birdwatching aficionados are enchanted by the wonderful environment created by the musical calls of warblers, thrushes, and flycatchers within the woodland.

Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve:

Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve, which lies along the Sapta-Koshi River plain in Nepal's eastern tip, is a refuge for migratory species and wetland birds. This immaculate reserve, which covers an area of more than 175 square kilometres, is home to more than 500 different species of birds due to its diversified environment of grasslands, marshes, and oxbow lakes. Flocks of waterfowl, including the endangered Swamp Francolin, the elegant Sarus Crane, and the vibrant Indian Skimmer, are captivating sights for birdwatchers. For those who love birds, the reserve is a must-visit location because it is home to a diverse range of raptors, such as the magnificent Pallas Fish Eagle and the stately White-tailed Eagle.

Chitwan National Park:

Chitwan National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its rich biodiversity and breathtaking scenery, covers 932 square kilometres of unspoiled nature. There is an amazing diversity of bird species in the park's various ecosystems, which range from rich meadows to deep sal forests. Through the park's network of paths, birdwatchers can go on thrilling safaris where they can spot notable species like the gorgeous Asian Paradise Flycatcher, the elusive Bengal Florican,

and the majestic Great Hornbill. In the middle of Nepal's breathtaking natural treasures, Chitwan National Park provides unrivalled chances for birdwatching, with over 500 recorded bird species, including numerous endangered and globally threatened species.
