

Luxury Everest Base Camp Heli Trek

Trip Overview

A premium way to experience the Everest region of Nepal is with the Everest Heli Trek. Those who like to investigate the Everest base camp from both the air and the ground might join this excursion. This trip's main focus is the hike to Everest Base Camp and the [helicopter ride](#) back to Kathmandu. Most treks follow simple itineraries that involve walking to base camp and then taking a helicopter to reach the summit. Highland Eco Trek offers a different approach, though. A helicopter ride to Kalapathar via base camp is an option after climbing to the Everest View Hotel, from where you can return to Lukla or Kathmandu.

A month-long vacation may be necessary if you want to visit nearly every part of the Everest region. For the majority of people in the world today, this is not feasible. Thus, Everest Heli Trekking is a wise way to explore the mountain.

What is the difference between the Everest Helicopter Tour and the Everest Heli Trek?

We provide a helicopter trip package that allows visitors to see Nepal's Everest region. The helicopter tour, however, lasts roughly four to five hours, including the return trip. It offers a bird's-eye view of Mount Everest. You have to go around the region to get a real sense of the place and the people who live there. Experience trekking the Everest Base Camp Trek route and make a luxurious return to Kathmandu. As part of the Everest Heli Trek, participants ascend to the Everest View Hotel, the world's highest hotel. It's a helicopter trip from here on out!

Analysis of the Everest Heli Trek Itinerary

Up until the first day of acclimatization, we will trek the Everest Base Camp itinerary. For any type of hiking or tourism activity in the area, Lukla is always the starting point. After we arrive in Lukla, our journey begins. To get to Namche Bazaar, trekkers must hike through Sagarmatha National Park. The honeymoon stretch of the Everest trekking route is so named for this particular portion. It's because the trail is easy and there's less chance of altitude sickness. The Hillary Twin Bridge to the Everest View Hotel is the only elevation gain!

Trekkers can explore the Namche Bazaar by taking a stroll through the marketplace. With an abundance of restaurants, pubs, stores, banks, and other leisure options, the market is the largest and most likely the highest-located town.

The trekkers go to the Everest View Hotel the following day for lunch and a panoramic view of the Himalayas. They will spend the night once more in Namche Bazaar. It facilitates appropriate acclimatization.

Is it possible to land at Everest Base Camp?

At Everest Base Camp, landing is not feasible. As a result, the travellers land the helicopter in Kalapathar (5545 m) after flying above the base camp. This is the ideal spot to see the upper valley and Mount Everest. The helicopter leaves and heads back to Lukla after around thirty minutes. You have the option of staying overnight in Lukla and taking a flight to Kathmandu, or you can carry on with the helicopter tour to Kathmandu.

Is the Everest View Trek doable all year long?

The Everest View Trek is open year-round. The winter months are bearable despite the great cold because we will be spending the night in Namche Bazaar (3400 m). Although you can go on this quick stroll in Nepal throughout the year, the best seasons to go are spring and fall, when the weather is clear and pleasant.

Day 01: Pick up from airport transfer to the Hotel

Day 02: Flight from Kathmandu to Lukla (2840m) Then Trek to Phakding (2610m)

Day 03: Trek from Phakding to Namche Bazaar

Day 04: Trek from Namche to Everest view hotel

Day 05: Trek from Everest view hotel to Debuche

Day 06: Trek from Debuche to Dingbuche

Day 07: Acclimatization day

Day 08: Trek from Dingbuche to Lobuche

Day 09: Trek from Lobuche to Gorakshep then visit Everest base camp and back to Gorakshep

Day 10: Morning visit kalapathar and fly back to Kathmandu via Lukla

Day 11: Fly your destination

Cost Includes

- pickups and drops in a private airport vehicle upon arrival and departure.
- All ground transportation is on a comfortable private vehicle as per the itinerary.
- Star hotel accommodation in Kathmandu with breakfast (the hotel standard will be changed as you wish).
- The Kathmandu Sightseeing Tour includes all entry fees, a tour guide, and a private vehicle as per the itinerary.
- The teahouse twins shared basic accommodations during the trek.
- Domestic flights as per the itinerary.
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner during the trek.
- An experienced, English-speaking, and government-licensed trekking guide.
- Porter service (2 trekkers: 1 porter).

Cost Excludes

- Nepal Entry visa fees

- Meals not indicated in the City
- International flights
- Personal equipment (a suggested list will be mailed to you)
- Travel and rescue insurance (**Required**)
- Tips to the guide, porter, driver, or any other trekking staff.
- Other expenses of a personal nature.
